Flxible buses are iconic Americana. First produced in the 1920s, they were once familiar sights on highways. The peculiar name dates to the company's 1913 origins as the Flxible Side Car Company, a maker of motorcycle extensions in Loudonville, Ohio.

The Willmores love meeting other Flxible fans at Flxible bus reunions, or "rallies" as they are known among members of the Flxible Owners International Club. A typical get-together might include a pilgrimage to Loudonville for a taste of the now-defunct company's origins. These biannual bus fests attract around 50 Flxibles and their owners. Sadly, Ben explains that while his bus often wins an enthusiastic thumbs-up from motorists, "fellow Flxible buffs are few and far between because these buses are rather rare."
